A Different way of Helping Operation Rebirth...

As a member of the Operation Rebirth Board of Directors, the current and future funding of this vital ministry is always a concern. As an enthusiastic (some would say obsessive) bicyclist, I've often thought of how I could make my passion for riding count for something more than just my personal benefit and enjoyment. Here's something that I hope will cover both of these thoughts.

This year I've registered to ride in "Calvin's Challenge," a 12-hour bicycle race held on Saturday, April 30. It's pretty simple; the race starts at 7:30 AM, and ends at 7:30 PM, and in between, you ride a 50 mile and/or 7 mile loop, and at the end, how far did you ride? Their 2 biggest rules: "Always perfect weather", and "No whining allowed." I did this in 2007, and completed three full 51.4 mile loops for a total of 154.2 miles. The weather was perfect, as long as you consider rain, a 20 degree drop in temperature, and 25mph headwinds on 3 of the 4 legs of the third loop "perfect..." My goal this year is to complete 3 full laps plus at least one short 7 mile lap, which will put me at 160+ miles.

NOW, here's where you come in: This year I've decided that besides riding for the challenge, I want it to count for something more, and want to use this as an opportunity to raise funds for the Operation Rebirth Endowment Fund. I'm asking you, if you're reading this, to help me help them by pledging some amount for each mile I ride, or making a flat donation to the Operation Rebirth Endowment Fund. All contributions are tax-deductible.

I haven't set a goal for donations, so any and all amounts are appreciated. If you make a pledge of 10 cents/mile, it would cost you \$16. 15 cents/mile is \$24; 25 cents/mile is \$40, and so on. You can also look at www.calvinschallenge.com for more information about the race, and probably, by noon on May 1, they'll have the results posted. (I'll be in the men's 56-60 age classification). There, you can check my results if you've decided to make a pledge based on my mileage.

What's in it for me? Simply the challenge of completing 12 hours of competitive riding, and being motivated to go farther to help Operation Rebirth go further in its ministry.

Then for a winter adventure they went looking for skunk cabbage at Kiser Lake. They were happy to report there were three skunk cabbage, blooming.


